The Road Less Traveled

Jesus had a lot to say about the path to wisdom, righteousness, and humility. As Christ completed the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7), it calls to his listeners to understand how narrow the road was to heaven and warned about the two religions in our world. You might think, "wait, aren't there hundreds of religions in the world?" Not really. When reduced to their common denominator, we find there are only two. There is God's, and there is man's. God's is of faith; man's is of works. God's is of grace. Man's is of law. God's is of the Spirit. Man's is of the flesh. God's leads to heaven; man's leads to hell.

Man's religion is like the pretty present with a bow; however, it is nothing but worthless dust inside. God's glorious gospel stands alone, unattractive, and repulsive to the natural man! Yet, it contains treasures that will last for all eternity!

We find that we are called upon to make a choice. Everyone will make that choice, and it will be evident by what we do. As we read Matthew 7:13-27 we see the following outline emerge:

I. There Are Two Gates. v13-14

A. 'Enter ye in at the strait gate'

- 1. The word 'enter' is an imperative verb.
 - a. It conveys a sense of urgency.
 - b. It is a demand for action right now!
 - c. It isn't enough to stand and observe the gate...one must enter!
- 2. It is important that we enter in the right gate.
 - a. There is only one gate that opens to the narrow way.
 - b. There is only one correct choice to be made here.

(John 10:9) I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture.

(John 10:1) Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that entereth not by the door into the sheepfold, but climbeth up some other way, the same is a thief and a robber.

- c. Christ is the gate...there is no other way to heaven!
- 3. A person will not just stumble through the gate.
 - a. "Few there be that find it."

(Luke 13:24) Strive to enter in at the strait gate: for many, I say unto you, will seek to enter in, and shall not be able.

b. No one is accidentally saved.

c. We must make a conscious decision to place our faith in Christ.

(Jer 29:13) And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart.

- B. "Broad is the way..."
 - 1. It suits the carnal mind.
 - a. Some folks are proud of the fact that they are broad-minded.
 - b. That simply means that they have no standards or guidelines by which to live.
 - c. There is plenty of room for the world, and its philosophy.
 - 2. It is a crowded way.

a. "Many there be which go in thereat"

b. Sometimes in a large crowd a person can be pushed or carried along with very little effort.

c. It is an easy path to travel, one that is well worn by the multitudes who have gone on before.

- 3. It is a fatal way.
 - a. "That leadeth to destruction"

b. It isn't marked properly; our enemy is the master of deception.

(Prov 14:12) There is a way which seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death.

c. He makes the gate look like it is the door to heaven...but nothing could be farther from the truth!

C. The choice is ours.

(Jer 21:8) And unto this people thou shalt say, Thus saith the LORD; Behold, I set before you the way of life, and the way of death.

1. Which way will we choose?

- 2. Will we go along with the crowd, or will we choose to follow Christ?
- 3. Our choice makes all of the difference in this world and in the world to come!

II. There Are Two Identities. v15-20

A. How do we identify someone who makes the correct choice?

1. We cannot tell just by looking.

- 2. Many make an outward show of spirituality, but...
- 3. Within they are wolves in sheep's clothing.
- 4. Paul said that even Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light!

B. Jesus said, "Wherefore, by their fruits ye shall know them."

- 1. Some will bear good fruit...
- 2. Some will bear evil or corrupt fruit...
- 3. Those trees, which do not bear good fruit, will be destroyed.
- C. What kind of fruit are we bearing in our lives?

III. There Are Two Professions. v21-23

- A. False profession.
 - 1. Some call Him Lord, but do not do His will.
 - 2. They may even do good works in His name, but ...
 - 3. Jesus said, "I never knew you..."

B. True profession.

- 1. He that doeth the will of the Father will enter heaven.
- 2. Christianity is not just a matter of the lips...it is a matter of the heart!

(Rom 10:9) That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved.

3. Have you made a true profession of faith in Christ?

IV. There Are Two Foundations. v24-27

- A. One is on shifting sands.
 - 1. These are they who hear, but will not obey.
 - 2. The structure stood for a time, but...
 - 3. It could not withstand the storms!
 - 4. A person may choose the sands of this world upon which to build, but it will not last!
 - 5. Their life will come crashing in upon them.
- B. One is on the solid Rock.
 - 1. The man who makes this choice is considered to be wise.

2. With the proper foundation, Jesus Christ, his life will be able to hold up to the trials and difficulties that will come.

3. This represents the one who will hear the Word of God, and will choose to obey it!

Will we choose God's way or man's way? It is up to us. We are challenged to choose the strait gate and the narrow way. Most people are self-deceived. Anybody in any form of religion under the category of human achievement is deceived. Why would you be in religion at all? Why bother with it? Why restrict your life? Why try to subdue your sin? Why?

These are the words of our Lord at the end of this great Sermon:

1. Don't be on that broad road.

- 2. Find the narrow way.
- 3. Cry out to God to give you the strength and disconnect you from your sin and all that holds you back.
- 4. Come through the door of Jesus Christ to the narrow way which indeed leads to heaven.

We must choose to bear good fruit in our lives, to serve Christ with our hearts, and to build our lives upon Him and His Word. It is not an easy road. Christ tells us it won't be easy in Matthew 16:24. *"If anyone wants* to come after Me, he must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow Me."

Let's pray -

Dear Lord, thank you. Thank you for your wisdom and your direction in our lives. This message gives us a choice and makes the message clear: there is a narrow gate and a narrow way that leads to life, life eternal, and life abundant. It may be hard to find, but we have been given the directions directly to it in Your Word: "Come to Christ."

Lord, there is nothing we can do to purchase access to the narrow way. It is a gift of grace given to those who believe in You, in Your sacrificial death and resurrection. I pray, Lord, that You will open the hearts of those who have been hypocritical, those who don't know You and You don't know them. Do what You can only do; awaken the heart, give life, for Your glory we pray. Amen.

Freedom in Christ Author: Candis Oswalt

Now the Lord is that Spirit: and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty. II Corinthians 3:17

In approaching this topic of devotion for July, we first need to define the word freedom. Merriam Webster dictionary lists ten subsets of definitions to the word freedom. I have chosen the first three to build on for our edification in this writing, as I believe these are the most relatable to the topic.

a: the absence of necessity, coercion,

or constraint in choice or action

Let us begin with the first one as it ties directly into our first form of freedom with the Lord. We have free will. Father God created us with a free will to decide whom we would follow. You may say there is coercion because not following him means an eternity of hell and suffering. However, the choice is still ours. There is no coercion brought to bear on us in making a choice to follow Jesus Christ. One of the most quoted verses about this free will is most likely:

Joshua 24:15 And if it seems evil unto you to serve the LORD, choose you this day whom ye will serve...

Therefore have the free will to choose to follow Jesus Christ, seeking forgiveness is a free choice and brings freedom.

b: liberation from slavery or restraint or from the power of another

Here, then is the second area of freedom we will cover. Liberation (freedom) as noted in the opening scripture the word liberty and freedom are quite interchangeable. With our freedom in Christ, paid for by His death and resurrection, we are no longer under the power of the "prince of this earth or air or his minions." He has no authority over us as we belong to Jesus Christ and His Spirit dwells in us, and we are no longer living in fear.

Romans 8:15-16

15 For ye have not received the Spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father. 16 The Spirit itself beareth witness with our Spirit, that

we are the children of God:

We are no longer slaves to fear but sons and daughters of the highest God. Given victory and freedom over/ from death, hell and the grave through Jesus Christ. c: the quality or state of being exempt or

released usually from something onerous

To me this third subset definition is so closely related to and brought forth from the first two we have discussed. We are no longer bound by sin or the master of sin.We are no long held captive or enslaved to fleshly living but are living after the Spirit and therein is liberty. We have freedom from sin – no longer bound in iniquities clutches but completely loosed from sin-we are now bound in Jesus Christ and He in us.

Luke 13:11-12

11 And, behold, there was a woman which had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bowed together, and could in no wise lift up herself. 12 And when Jesus saw her, he called her to him, and said unto her, Woman, thou art loosed from thine infirmity.

John 14:20-21, 23

20 At that day ye shall know that I am in my Father, and ye in me, and I in you. 21 He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that loveth me: and he that loveth me shall be loved of my Father, and I will love him, and will manifest myself to him. 23 Jesus answered and said unto him, if a man loves me, he will keep my words: and my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him.

Just as this woman was no longer bound by that Spirit so we are no longer bound by sin, shame, guilt, and condemnation, but instead are filled with the love, grace, and mercy of Jesus Christ and God the Father through the Holy Spirit. Wow, what amazing freedom there is in that.

In closing, I would like to go to a passage that brings me such release, freedom, and liberty, although not everybody would see this scripture that way.

John 15:5 I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing.

Let us grab hold of this illustration that Jesus Christ uses in this passage. He is stating that He is the vine, and we are the branch. If we abide in Him, we will bring forth much fruit (be productive in the fruit of the Spirit). It is the vine that brings forth all the nourishment, it is the vine that seeks the water and what is needed for the branch to bring forth the fruit. It is solely the vines responsibility to keep the branch alive and well by filling it and providing it with everything it needs. The branch simply abides in the vine. The branch does not take off on its own seeking water or shelter or any other thing, it simply abides in the vine. Now, understand me, I am not trying to say we all can get lazy and that we are not supposed to proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ, I am saying we are the branches, and He is the vine, and He provides all we need if we will simply rest (Heb 4:9) in Him.

In his book "Ye the Branches, The Mystery of the True Vine," Andrew Murray says, "You are the branch. You need be nothing more. You need not for one single moment of the day take upon you the responsibility of the Vine. You need not leave the place of entire dependence and unbounded confidence."

What an amazing freedom to realize that I do not for one single moment need to try to be the vine. I must be the branch and rest in the Lord, the true vine. Such amazing liberty and freedom found in this beautiful thought. Abide in Christ.

This then is our liberation and freedom, dependence on not independence from GOD.

Book Club: The Book of Malachi

Other Notes	Malachi's literary style employs a dramatic use of questions asked by God and his people (for example, 3:7, 8).
Author	Malachi
Recipients	People in Jerusalem
Length of Book	4 Chapters
Key Phrases/Terms	"Surely the day is coming; it will burn like a furnace. All the arrogant and every evildoer will be stubble, and the day that is coming will set them on fire," says the Lord Almighty.
Setting	Malachi, Haggai, and Zechariah were postexilic prophets to Judah (the southern kingdom). Haggai and Zechariah rebuked the people for their failure to rebuild the Temple. Malachi confronted them with their neglect of the Temple and their false and profane worship.

Spurred on by the prophetic activity of Haggai and Zechariah, the returned exiles under the leadership of their governor Zerubbabel finished the temple in 516 B.C. In 458 the community was strengthened by the coming of the priest Ezra and several thousand more Jews. Artaxerxes king of Persia encouraged Ezra to reconstitute the temple worship (Ez 7:17) and to make sure the law of Moses was being obeyed (Ez 7:25-26).

Fourteen years later (444) the same Persian king permitted his cupbearer Nehemiah to return to Jerusalem and rebuild its walls (Ne 6:15). As newly appointed governor, Nehemiah also spearheaded reforms to help the poor (Ne 5:2-13), and he convinced the people to shun mixed marriages (Ne 10:30), to keep the Sabbath (Ne 10:31) and to bring their tithes and offering faithfully (Ne 10:37-39)

In 433 B.C. Nehemiah returned to the service of the Persian king, and during his absence the Jews fell into sin once more. Later, however, Nehemiah came back to Jerusalem to discover that the tithes were ignored, the Sabbath was broken, the people had intermarried with foreigners, and the priests had become corrupt (Ne 13:7-31). Several of these same sins are condemned by Malachi (1:6-14; 2:14-16; 3:8-11).

- 3. Israel's Unfaithfulness Rebuked (1:6-2:16)
- 4. The Lord's Coming Announced (2:17-4:16)

THEMES AND THEOLOGY

The theological message of the book can be summed up in one sentence: The Great King (1:14) will come not only to judges his people (3:1-5; 4:1) but also to bless and restore them (3:6-12; 4:2).

Although the Jews had been allowed to return from exile and rebuild the temple, several discouraging factors brought about a general religious malaise: (1) Their land remained but a small province in the backwaters of the Persian empire, (2) the glorious. future announced by the prophets (including the other postexilic prophets, Haggai and Zechariah) had not (yet) been realized, and (3) their God had not (yet) come to his temple (3:1) with majesty and power (as celebrated in Ps 68) to exalt his kingdom in the sight of the nations. Doubting God's covenant love (1:2) and no longer trusting his justice (2:17; 3:14-15), the Jews of the restored community began to lose hope. So their worship degenerated into a listless perpetuation of mere forms, and they no longer took the law seriously.

Malachi rebukes their doubt of God's love (1:2-5) and the faithlessness of both priests (1:6-2:9) and people (2:10-16). To their charge that God is unjust (2:17) because he has failed to come in judgment to exalt his people, Malachi answers with an announcement and a warning. The Lord they seek will come—but he will come "like a refiner's fire" (3:1-4). He will come to judge—but he will judge his people first (3:5).

Because the Lord does not change in his commitments and purpose, Israel has not been completely destroyed for her persistent unfaithfulness (3:6). But only through repentance and reformation will she again experience God's blessing (3:6-12). Those who honor the Lord will be spared when he comes to judge (3:16-18).

In conclusion, Malachi once more reassures and warns his readers that "the day ['that great and dreadful day of the Lord,' 4:5] is coming" and that "it will burn like a furnace" (4:1). In that day the righteous will rejoice, and "you will trample down the wicked" (4:2-3). So "remember the law of my servant Moses" (4:4). To prepare his people for that day the Lord will send "the prophet Elijah" to call them back to the godly ways of their forefathers (4:5-6).

- ²⁴ And when he had begun to reckon, One was brought unto him, which owed him ten thousand talents.
- ²⁵ But forasmuch as he had not to pay, his lord commanded him to be sold, and his wife, and children, and all that he had, and payment to be made.

- ³¹ So when his fellow servants saw what was done, they were very sorry, and came and told unto their Lord all that was done.
- ³² Then his lord, after that he had called him, said unto him, O thou wicked servant,
 I forgave thee all Your Debt, because that's what you desired of me:
- ³³ Shouldest not thou also have had compassion on thy fellowservant, even as I had pity on thee?
- ³⁴ And his lord was wroth, and delivered him to the tormentors, till he should pay all that was due unto him.
- 35 <u>So likewise shall my heavenly Father do also unto you,</u> if ye from your Hearts, DO NOT FORGIVE every one his brother their trespasses.

... BUT What's NOT Included In This Long List, .. IS <u>OUR</u> FREE WILL of CHOICE ! JESUS Said in MATT. 24:12 . . "Because INIQUITY Shall Abound, . . the LOVE of Many Shall Grow COLD."

AND Lets NOT FORGET the Apostle PAUL, When HE Said in I COR. 9:26-27 ...

... "So I Run straight to the Goal, [HOW ?] ... with Purpose in every step. I FIGHT TO WIN ! I'm Not Shadow Boxing, ... I'm Not Playing Around !

SO, . . [Or This is Why] . . I Keep my Body under Subjection and Train it to do What its suppose to Do, and Not Let it Do, what it wants to Do, . . otherwise, I Fear That after having preached to others, . . I myself, might become a [KJV] CASTAWAY !"

DON'T EVER UNDERESTIMATE the POWER of PRIDE !

"PRIDE" is That "TREE" That You Don't Want to Find Yourself Eating From !!

I PETER 5:5 says; "For GOD Resists the PROUD, But HE gives GRACE to the Humble."

HEB. 6;4-9 says; "For it is <u>IMPOSSIBLE</u> to Restore and bring again to repentance,

those who have been once enlightened, who have consciously tasted the heavenly gift and have become sharers of the Holy Spirit." And have felt how good the Word of God is and the mighty powers of the age and world to come."

"If they then, DEVIATE from the FAITH and TURN AWAY [DEPART = APOSTACY] from their Allegiance – (He says; "it is IMPOSSIBLE) to bring them back to repentance, for they nail upon the cross, the Son of God afresh, and are holding him up to contempt and shame and public disgrace."

(Now, IF it says Here in HEB. 6 . . That it is IMPOSSIBLE, . . WHY Does it say

in MATT. 19:26 "That with GOD, ALL things are POSSIBLE ?"

IT'S Because Once Again, GOD Will NOT Push His Righteousness on Anybody !

IF You FALL Into the MIND SET, That YOU NO LONGER Want Forgiveness, ...

GOD Says; "SO BE IT !"

HEB. 6 continues to say; "For the soil which has drunk the rain, that repeatedly falls upon it and produces vegetation useful to those for whose benefit it is cultivated partakes of a Blessing From GOD."

"But IF that <u>Same Soil</u>, <u>Persistently</u> bears thorns and thistles, it is considered worthless and near to being cursed, whose end is to be burned."

II TIM. 2:19 says; "Let everyone who confesses the Name of Christ, <u>DEPART</u> FROM SIN." GRACE Doesn't Give US an EXCUSE to SIN, . . BUT on the Contrary, IT Should TEACH US to LEARN From OUR SIN, and GET OUT of the SIN BUSINESS !

II PETER 1:10 – 11 says; "Therefore <u>Brethren</u>, be even more DILIGENT to make your <u>CALLING and ELECTION SURE</u>, . . for <u>IF</u> you do these things<u>, YOU WILL</u> <u>NEVER FALL;</u> And you will receive a Rich Welcome into the eternal Kingdom of our Lord and Savior JESUS CHRIST !!

II PETER 3:17 says;". . his letters, (talking about PAUL) contain some things that are hard to understand, which ignorant and unstable people distort, as they do other scriptures, to their own destruction; Therefore, my friends, since you Already Know This, [He's Talking to the BELIEVER] . . be on your guard so that you may NOT be carried away by the error of Lawless men and <u>FALL from your SECURE</u> <u>POSITION</u>; . . Apostles Creed Author: Mark Pitman

What we have come to know as the "Apostles Creed" has a long history and has been forgotten throughout the ages. However, its meaning is the core of our Christian faith. The Apostles Creed summarizes and is essential to our walk with God. It is fundamental to our profession of Jesus Christ as Lord of our lives. Just like we teach our children the "Pledge of Allegiance" to celebrate the birth of our nation we should do so with the Apostles Creed.

Our nation's birth goes deep back to our founding fathers—the principles which our nation was founded on lie within the creed itself. So let's take a look at the history and the purpose of the creed. As you read the following excerpts, reflect on your own life and see if it lines up with the core essentials of the Christian life found in the Apostles Creed. If you don't know Jesus as your Lord and Savior, there is an invitation provided for you at the end. Would you please not let another day go by without accepting this invitation? {Mark Pitman}

The Apostles' Creed

We believe in God, the Father Almighty, the Maker of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord: Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; (He descended into hell.)1 On the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of God the Father; from which he will come to judge the living and the dead. We believe in the Holy Spirit; the holy catholic church; {The word "catholic" is

intentionally left lowercase in the sense that the word catholic applies to the universal and ecumenical Christian church.}

the communion of saints;

the forgiveness of sins;

the resurrection of the body; and life everlasting.



What is the Apostles' Creed?

Where Did the Apostles' Creed Come From?

The Apostles' Creed is not the invention of theologians, just as it was not the invention of the apostles. It was formulated by them, of course, but it came from what really happened in history and what really happened in their hearts and lives as a result of what really happened in history.

At our best, apart from God's intervention, we would not have created a philosophy that confessed God's supremacy and glory. Our creed would have asserted (not confessed) the accomplishments of ourselves. It would include the phrases "We think" and "We feel." But the gospel at the center of the Apostles' Creed is the shaper of the lives who confess it. It "makes" the confession "We believe."

At the end of Matthew's Gospel, Jesus gives his followers the threefold task of the church throughout the ages: 1) "make disciples of all nations"; 2) "baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit"; and 3) "teaching them to obey everything I have commanded."

In its earliest days, the church developed statements of belief to guide these foundational activities. The church's evangelizing mission to the nations was aided by concise statements proclaiming the identity of Jesus and his saving work, many of which are preserved in St. Paul's speeches and letters. The church's baptizing mission was accompanied by a profession of God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The church's teaching mission was facilitated with summaries of Jesus' instructions and the central truths of the faith. In the ancient church, the creed was instrumental in fulfilling this threefold ministry of the church, and it continues to serve these same purposes today.

Yet, the early church knew that it is not the articulation of the creed that brings people to faith. It is the ongoing presence of Jesus with his church through the Spirit. The last verse of Jesus' instructions insures his followers of the reality behind the words: "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (see Mt 28:20). In the church's evangelization, sacramental ministry and ongoing formation of disciples, the presence of Jesus is the heart, but the creed helps the church to carry out the tasks that Jesus commanded with the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

We don't believe in statements of faith, but in those realities they express. Yet, we approach these realities with the help of formulated statements that allow us to express the faith and hand it on, to celebrate it in communal worship, to assimilate it in prayer, and to live it more fully in active witness in the world. Here are some of the most important purposes of the creed:

Central truths

The creed is a summary of the central truths of Christian faith. It is not intended to be a complete compendium of beliefs expressed in the Bible. It focuses, rather, on the fundamental truths that characterize the life of a Christian believer. As an acorn contains all the elements of a large and verdant tree, the creed condenses into a few words the great faith contained in the Old and New Testaments.

As the authentic and authorized summary of Christian truth, the creed is a symbol of the faith of the whole church. It provides a sign of reception into the church and of membership in the community of faith. By reciting the creed, we state our personal and communal identity. We affirm that we are united in faith with the ancient church and with our fellow believers.

The creed was never meant to be a substitute for personal faith, for a trusting relationship with God. The creed, rather, gives substance to our personal faith. We profess our faith not in the words but in the reality to which they point.

Reciting the creed does not make us Christians, but it reminds us of the truths of our salvation and gives us an opportunity to personally affirm them.

Rule of faith

The creed is the rule of faith for the Christian life. It supplies a map that lays out the fundamental contours of how the Christian thinks about God and the history of salvation. This map of belief synthesizes the Christian faith and prevents the believer from taking a wrong turn and getting lost. It marks the boundaries of Christian belief and protects the church's essential teachings.

Before the church had a relatively fixed creed, the early theologians referred to the church's communal selfconsciousness as the regula fidei ("rule of faith"). Although it was articulated in various forms, it presented the essential beliefs inherited from the apostles and passed on through the church. This was understood as the faith which was held "always, everywhere, and by all" (St. Vincent of Lerins, The Commitorium, 4, 3) and assured by the Holy Spirit.

This rule of faith, soon to be called a creed, expressed the faith which converts received from the teaching Church and were to keep as the standard for their subsequent life. With this rule of faith, Christians were able to interpret the Scriptures according to the mind of the church and test all other doctrines presented to them.

Throughout the church's history, the creed has served as this standard of belief which tests all others and serves the church as the expression of its common faith.

Christian theology, it evaluates theological opinions by testing them for consistency against what has been firmly believed. As a synthesis of the Gospel, the creed helps us understand its meaning and guides us in applying the principles of Scripture to the Christian life

Evangelization tool

The creed is a springboard for evangelization. The believer has received faith from other people and should desire to hand it on to others. Our love for God and other people, and the gratitude we feel for our faith, should impel us to speak to others about it. Yet, evangelization is difficult, especially if we haven't thought much about the content of our faith.

The creed is an ideal starting point for the crucial process of consolidating our grasp of the faith. It offers the Christian vision of the world's origins, meaning and destiny, and presents God's saving work in a clear and simple statement of beliefs. The creed is not complicated and ambiguous. It requires no hidden knowledge or superior intellect, and can be affirmed and understood by children as well as adults.

The creed focuses on what unites believers, rather than on what divides them. It thus encourages the kind of ecumenical understanding called for by the church today. The statements of the creed establish strong and clear boundaries for Christian belief, but those boundaries do not become barriers that exclude those who might not yet be able to accept other points of doctrine.

As we study the ancient confessions of the church, we develop our ability to express our faith in tune with the received wisdom of the ages. In our confused and creedless age, which hesitates to acknowledge any unchanging truth, our testimony to the ancient wisdom of the church and the guidance of God's Spirit can offer refreshment and confidence to those seeking the unconditional truth and love of our saving God. By articulating our own experience of faith in union with the words of the creed, we cultivate Christian testimony worthy of the Lord to whom we witness. {from : Understading the 5 Key Purposes of the Creed {Stephen J. "Father, forgive them for they know not what they are doing."

It was on the cusp of death when Jesus could have cursed them. He could have let the torment of injustice turn to anger. His condemnation would have been validated. However, in all of these feelings and emotions, He chose the most extraordinary power He could. It was love. MOTORCYCLE MATTERS

10 Fall Motorcycle Riding Tips: Safe Touring in Autumn



1. Beware of Falling Leaves

This is true on the road, but especially on the trails. Falling leaves create visual hazards, especially if they are wet. They can stick to your visor easily, or block a tree branch that's extending into your path of travel. Don't get distracted by leaves, regardless of how mesmerizing they are while falling.

2. Beware of Leaves on the Ground

Leaves on the ground present as equal of a hazard as falling ones. They cover up holes on the trails, rocks, or any other object protruding from the ground. On the road, also, they can cover up drain ditches and waterways. And remember that though leaves look dry, they ones on the ground are likely wet, which will quickly cause traction issues and a disaster on the trail.

3. Cooler Concrete, Less Traction

That says it all. Tires will come up to temperature with continuous riding, but it'll take much longer. And when stopping the tires cool down much faster, which naturally creates less traction on the road. The off-road will also be slicker due to cooler rocks and dirt.

4. Layer Up!

Layering is the only way to go during autumn riding. Start with good base layers and mid layers, and always pack along an extra fleece or something similar for added warmth. This allows you to easily adjust your comfort zone while out riding.



5. Don't Forget the Rain Gear

Fall is the most unpredictable time of the year. You can be riding in pure sunshine at 70 degrees (F), and then it can drop to 50 and start raining. Even the light mist can penetrate your gear, so make sure your outer layers are up to par in the waterproof department. If you're wearing gear that's not waterproof, don't forget the rain suit!

6. Wildlife: Extra Caution Needed

Wildlife is more active searching for food in fall, which has them scattered. Deer usually feed close to roads, and their most active feeding time is dusk and dawn. Fall is a time for hunting, also, which will further scatter animals like deer and turkey. Work on maximizing peripheral vision to proactively recognize a threat and react, such as covering your brakes while slowing down, and always keep your eyes moving.

7. Beware Frosty Roads

Regardless of how warm the day temperatures can get, the mornings can provide some frosty conditions. Even the thinnest layer of frost can result in a loss of traction. Try to stay in the middle of the road since more frost will collect around the edges, and preferably ride in car-tire tracks.

8. Camping? Make Sure You Got the Essentials

Remember, it's autumn, and it can be 75 during the day and 40 at night. Plan accordingly if you're going to camp—something we highly recommend due to the beauty. Just be prepared with a warmer sleeping bag, and find the most optimal place for a tent that won't take on any water or morning fog. For more, check out or Fall Camping Tips.

9. Check Tires and Fluids

Now is not the time to question your thread depth. If the tread depth is less than 2/32 of inch deep, you need some new skins. The easiest way to find out is place a penny upside down in your tread grove. If you can see Lincoln's hair, it's time for a new set. As we said, concrete is colder, and traction is less. Add some rain and you'll want to be channeling that water away from the surface of your tires.

Also, check your fluids and top off if needed. You don't want dirty brake fluid to thicken up quickly while riding in the colder weather. And for those with liquid-cooled engines, make sure your coolant is fresh

10. Check Weather Often

Weather conditions are very unpredictable in fall, and fronts moving in can drop temperatures in a hurry. Keep an even closer eye on your favorite weather app while riding, especially if you're ADV touring and have some long distances to travel. This proactiveness is crucial to your riding comfort and safety, allowing you to plan a route around unstable skies, or find a hotel/campsite.
